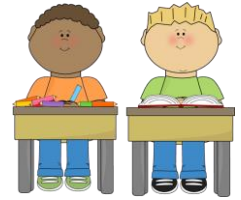


Behavioral Expectations

Behavior System

All students start each day on green. If a student follows our class rules, the clip stays green. (YEAH!!!! Congratulations, your child is kindergartener who can follow the rules!) If they go above and beyond the expectations, they have the opportunity to move their clip up to purple or pink. (Purple and pink days are very rare to come by, so if your child comes home on purple, please make a big deal out of their great behavior.) My goal is to acknowledge and reaffirm smart choices.



If a student chooses to break a rule, these are the consequences:

First time: GREEN- Warning #1

Second time: Move clip to down YELLOW — The student will have a thinking time, away from the group.

Third time: If it happens again, the student will move their clip down to RED and fill out a “think sheet”. The think sheet is to help the student reflect on their behavior. We will also have a conference to talk about how they are going to change their behavior. They will bring the think sheet home for you to discuss, sign and return back to school the next day. (Depending on behavior, it is possible to lose recess or free choice time)

Fourth time: Student will call their parent on a break to talk about their behavior. If this continues, they will have a referral to talk with Mrs. Testani, our principal.

At the end of each day the child will color in their monthly calendar. Please initial in the box so that I know you have discussed your child’s behavior that day. I believe it is extremely important that we work together and provide consistent feedback to your child. I will be explaining and teaching the behavior system to the students all week but I would greatly appreciate it if you would review it with your child at home as well.

I want to teach the behavior that is expected in school. In kindergarten, we continually practice these behaviors throughout the year. In order to encourage superb behavior in our classroom, I will give positive reinforcement very frequently. Our classroom will be full of verbal compliments and rewards to students that are doing their best quality work. Thank you for your support. I am looking forward to a fun and successful year!
